- The city is better because there are more job opportunities, better public transport and more shops. Matilda W



The sports offered in Terms 2 and 3 are:

AFL Football (Girls and Boys Years 2-7, \$60/Terms 2 and 3) Training: TBC, possibly Wednesday at Glandore Oval, Games held Saturday mornings at Glandore Oval and other local school locations around western Adelaide.

Soccer (Years 2-7 Boys/Girls \$50 for Terms 2 and 3) Training: Thursday after school. Games held Saturday mornings at various venues.

Netball (Years 2-7, \$60 for Terms 2 and 3) Trainings: TBC on the day, but most are all after school. Games held mostly Saturday mornings, with a few potential after school games on a Friday for year 6/7's, depending on the draws.

Q. How do I add or delete payment cards?

The first step to audition for the GifT Dance program is to complete the *Registration of Interest Form*, available on the home page of the Mitcham Girls High School website <u>http://www.mitchamgirlshs.sa.edu.au/gifted-and-talented/dance/</u>.

Complete the form with as much information as possible so we have a clear picture of your previous dance experience. Having submitted the *Registration of Interest Form* you will then be contacted by the school, with your audition date and time. You will also be required to supply a headshot for the audition.

What to Wear for the Audition – Wear a plain black sleeveless leotard, with either plain black footless tights or convertible pink ballet tights. Dance shorts may be worn over the tights. Hair should be tied back neatly either in a pony-tail or bun. Shoes are not required.

You will participate in a grou class. The class will focus on jazz dance technique, with some elements of basic ballet technique. Previous experience in classical ballet is not a pre-requisite. You are not required to pre-prepare a dance sequence of your own.

There is no charge to audition.

The registration of interest for secondary school form allows parents of public school students starting secondary school in 2021 to advise of their preferred secondary school.

The registration of interest for secondary school form will be **available online**.

You can access the online form from a computer, tablet or mobile phone, as long as you can connect to the internet. It replaces the old paper form referred to by schools as an ED176.

The form has a unique URL for your child and applying online is easy.

Simply follow the steps below.

- STEP 1 From Term 2 you will receive an email or letter with the unique URL for the registration of interest for secondary school form for your child.
- STEP 2 Complete all mandatory fields.
- STEP 3 Once you have completed a page click on the 'NEXT' button.
- STEP 4 Once you have filled out all pages click the 'SUBMIT' button.

Paper forms will be available from your public primary school if you cannot access the internet. Parents of private school students wishing to attend a public secondary school in 2021 should email education.startingsecondaryschool@sa.gov.au for a form.

#### **Blackforest Primary School Piano Tuition 2019**



Ms Katherina Mustanow has over 25 years teaching experience, and has worked with Mrs Sivan from the age of five with generations of piano pedagogy stemming back to Ludwig Van Beethoven. Her piano student won the under 12 Norman-Sellick Memorial Prize 2015

(Music teachers Association of South Australia) \$600 cash prize. She has also been a teacher through the Anna Essipoff piano school and Blackforest Music for over 15 years, and Creative Music School 1995-2002.

She has been a council member of the Music Teachers Association of South Australia (MTASA) since 2013 and one of the executive board committee directors for Council of Educational Associations of South Australia (CEASA) 2014-2015.

She has been a part of the Blackforest Piano Programme since 1994-2008 and then resumed from 2013 - current.

For effective learning, students should aim to work in the following way: Students will have a 1/2 hour lesson and need to play the Piano for a minimum of 10 - 20 minutes, 5 days a week. For this to happen, a Piano needs to be available for students at home.

Each term will comprise of weekly individual lessons. There will be a Concert Practice Performance during the year. Parents, family members and friends are welcome and encouraged to attend these concerts.
